MEMORANDUM FOR ALL INDIVIDUALS ON MOODY AFB PROPERTY, INSTALLATIONS,
AND FACILITIES

SUBJECT: Face Covering Wear during COVID-19 Pandemic, Update 4

1. Consistent with Department of Defense Guidance on the Use of Cloth Face Coverings, dated 5 April 2020, to the extent practical, all individuals on Moody Air Force Base property, installations, and facilities will wear a cloth face covering when:

a. **In HPCON Alpha and cannot maintain six (6) feet of physical distance.**

b. **In HPCON Bravo and Charlie at all times while indoors, as well as outdoors when cannot maintain 6 feet of physical distance** (this directive does not include an Airman's or their family member's personal residence on a military installation). Members may remove their mask in their work centers if they have individual work locations (offices, desks, cubicles) or in specific areas designated by the commander, but they must be able to maintain six (6) feet of separation while their mask is removed.

c. **In HPCON Delta.**

2. Airmen are authorized to wear a cloth face covering while in uniform. Subordinate commanders and medical professionals are authorized to establish additional face covering guidance for their work centers, personnel, and patients. Face coverings worn while in uniform must be conservative in appearance and color (e.g., no neon colors, patterns, or graphics with the exception of unit specific heritage graphics), must cover both mouth and nose at all times during wear but may not cover eyes or impair hearing. Masks with valves are not authorized unless they are NIOSH certified N95s used by medical and first responder personnel. All individuals shall remove face coverings when entering security checkpoints.

3. Unit commanders are authorized to waive this policy for safety reasons. Customer service areas may implement a droplet barrier (such as glass or Plexiglas). Consultation with a base Public Health Emergency Officer is recommended for questions or concerns regarding risk mitigation or barriers.

4. Children ages two (2) and below, and those who cannot remove face coverings due to special health needs should not wear face coverings due to risk of suffocation.

5. This policy does not supersede DeCA or AAFES policies.
